
What are wearables?

High-tech, connected electronic devices worn on the body to sense or deliver information.


Wearables can:





5-point checklist for wearables security

- 1. Identify:**
Determine what you need to protect and what could go wrong.
- 2. Protect:**
Build in technical, process and people-related controls.
- 3. Detect:**
Develop warning capabilities in case something goes wrong.
- 4. Respond:**
Ensure processes and plans are in place to address problems.
- 5. Recover:**
Have disaster recovery and business continuity plans that allow you to get back to normal processing as quickly as possible.⁵
